Described by many as TV's heartthrob, Iqbal Khan's popularity is matched by only a few. Ever since he shot to fame as Angad in Kaisa Yeh Pyaar Hai eight years ago, Iqbal has been seen in many popular serials, most of which were his mentor Ekta Kapoor's K sagas.

But ever since he walked out of Balaji a few years ago, he has been quite selective about his work. Last seen in Sanjog Se Bani Sangini on Zee a year ago, the actor is now back in Rajshree's Yahan Main Ghar Ghar Kheli.

He is not sure of the character's length but promises that it will be an entertaining one. "It's a cameo to start with but you never know how long it will last," he says.
