But that's the game of cricket, full of surprises. I'm sure Australia will win the World Cup, though they should expect a tough time from the West Indies and South Africa.

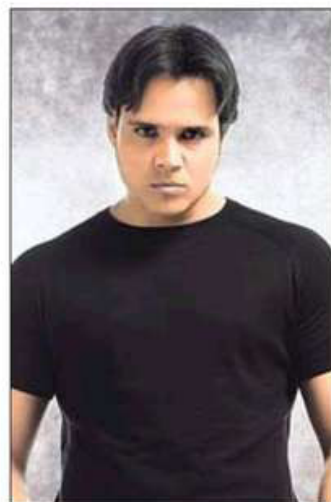


SALIL ANKOLA
