As he gears up for his new show, **Iqbal Khan** discusses his reasons for walking out of the last one with Deepali Dhingra

You're playing a toughie in your new show *Waaris*...

● Yes but I've always played a tough guy. You can't make me look cute! *(laughs)* But yes, it is a different kind of role and I'm very excited about playing it.

You will be seen playing a Don's son. Is it a negative character?
